

SYMBOLIC INTERACTIONISM

The symbolic interaction theory states that the meaning we ascribe to objects, processes, ideas, concepts, and systems are subjective.

EXAMPLE

As a simple example of symbolic interactionism, the word "dog" might evoke a fuzzy, heart-warming emotion in someone who has had mostly friendly experiences with dogs. But another person, who may have been bitten or attacked by dogs, may feel fear and revulsion. The meaning ascribed to the concept of "dog" is different depending on your context.

EXPLANATION

Symbol – Something that represents an object, emotion, process, etc., in the real world. E.g. the word "dog" is a symbol for a four-legged domesticated canine, and "cow" is a symbol for a four-legged bovine.

Interaction – How the meaning of a symbol is interpreted and modified through social interaction. The Hindu villager and the American Christian may lead them to invest the word "cow" with different meanings.

Symbolic interactionism places emphasis on the symbolic nature of language and the social construction of reality. It suggests that the meanings we attach to words and symbols are not inherent but rather emerge from our interactions with others.

DEFINITION

Communication accommodation theory is a theory of communication that attempts to explain and predict how people adjust (accommodate) their style of verbal and non-verbal communication in relation to one another.

FOUR PRINCIPLES

Communication accommodation theory has four basic principles:

- The importance of the socio-historical context in communication,
- Negotiation of social category memberships,
- Expectations regarding levels of accommodation, and
- The use of specific communication strategies to signal attitudes.

Communication accommodation theory explores the dynamic nature of communication, suggesting that individuals adapt their speech patterns, nonverbal cues, and other communicative behaviors to enhance their interactions with others.

Relational dialectics theory explains human interactions. The 4 key features of PDT are: contradiction, totality process and praxis. Below are the 4 key assumptions.

CONTRADICTION

Relationships are always in 'contradiction' because they have inbuilt tensions.

TOTALITY

The theory believes that you should look at the 'totality' of the contradictions in a relationship to see the challenges that exist and how to address them.

PROCESS

Relationships also are constantly in a 'process of change' so they never stay the same.

PRAXIS

'Praxis' is a word that explains how we act in a relationship; we can either accept and accommodate the other person's needs, or act out negatively when tensions occur.

Relational dialectics theory recognizes the coexistence of opposing forces within close relationships, such as the need for both autonomy and connection. It suggests that these tensions are not simply obstacles but rather inherent characteristics of healthy relationships.




